Activity 1 (Part 1): Generate Criteria:

For the problem you are trying to solve, come up with 4-5 criteria you will use to evaluate your ideas. Try using one of the stems listed here to get started:

"Will it..." "I hope that..." "Will they..." "There needs to be..."

Example: "Will it...be easy to understand for those outside of our organization?" "Will they...need specialized equipment to use this program?
