Thinking Skill: Fluency

Create a list of at least 10-15 things you like about spring and 10-15 things you do not like about spring.

Make a picture of the thing you like the most and tell why it is your favorite things about spring.

Thinking Skill: Flexibility

Create a chart of at least 10-15 different kinds of outdoor activities you can do with your friends. Be sure to label each idea with a category label. (*"This is an example of..."*)

Choose one of the categories. Try for 4-5 additional ideas for the category.

Thinking Skill: Originality

Generate a list (make a chart or class bulletin board) of common words that rhyme with spring and unusual words that rhyme with spring.

Create a story or poem that uses at least 4 of the common words and 4 of the unusual words.

Thinking Skill: Elaboration

Describe spring by generating several words relating to spring for each letter of spring. (this can also be a class bulletin board or chart.)

Thinking Skill: Elaboration

Spring is the perfect season for gardening! Why not create an Alphabet Garden?

Choose a mix of vegetables and flowers, finding a plant for each letter of the alphabet to include in your garden. Then, sketch a layout showing where each plant will grow. To make it even more exciting, add illustrations or pictures of the vegetables, or flowers they will produce!

Thinking Skill: Fluency

Create a chart or bulletin board of many words that sound like their meaning (onomatopoeia). Create a spring-related visual for each word on your chart.

Example: buzz—visual: a bug buzzing around the leaves on a plant.
